ORDINANCE NO. 006-117

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING PUBLIC BIDDING DISADVANTAGEOUS AND AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT FOR NON-REVENUE VEHICLE DIESEL FUEL

WHEREAS, The Chicago Transit Authority ("Authority') desires to obtain more reliable data concerning fuel consumption and mileage data for its non-revenue diesel fueled vehicles to improve CTA's scheduling and performing regular preventive maintenance, thereby increasing fleet availability; and

WHEREAS, Fueling non-revenue vehicles at City of Chicago locations would provide CTA the benefit of maintaining records of mileage on its vehicles that will enable CTA to schedule preventive maintenance; and

WHEREAS, The Authority previously executed an intergovernmental agreement with the City of Chicago for said fueling and maintenance, which is to provide CTA with a savings compared to its current situation; and

WHEREAS, The City of Chicago's diesel fuel contractor, Texor Petroleum Co., Inc., has agreed to provide diesel fuel for CTA vehicles at the same price and for the same length of time as in its competitively bid contract with the City of Chicago, until October 31, 2008; and

WHEREAS, Section 54.3-5 of the Regulations Governing Purchase and Sales Transactions provides for the award of contract in those situations where the Transit Board determines that competitive public bidding would be disadvantageous; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHICAGO TRANSIT BOARD OF THE CHICAGO TRANSIT AUTHORITY:

SECTION 1: That based on the statements set forth in the preamble of this ordinance, the Transit Board hereby determines that competitive public bidding for this requirement is disadvantageous.

SECTION 2: That the Chairman of the Board, or her designee, is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Texor Petroleum Co., Inc., for the supply of diesel fuel in the amount of \$1,500,000.00 under Requisition No. B03OP02020.

SECTION 3: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
