

ORDINANCE NO. 006-119

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING PUBLIC
BIDDING DISADVANTAGEOUS AND
AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH UNISYS
CORPORATION FOR THE PURCHASE
LICENSING AND SUPPORT FOR THE FINAL
FOUR MONTHS OF OPERATION OF THE
MICROSOFT/CLEARPATH UNISYS
ENTERPRISE SERVER, MODEL CS7402

WHEREAS, The Chicago Transit Authority currently utilizes a Microsoft/Clearpath Unisys Enterprise Server that supports multiple facilities; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago Transit Authority was in need of licensing and support for the final 4 months of operation of the server to complete the migration of applications running on a propriety Unisys system to a dual platform server; and

WHEREAS, Based on the complexity of the migration, 4 months of software license payments accrued due to the migration not being complete as scheduled within the original contract time frame; and

WHEREAS, The migration has been completed and the Chicago Transit Authority can make final payment to Unisys Corporation and allow for closeout of any obligations it may have under Contract No. C03FR1740; and

WHEREAS, Section 54.3-5 of the Regulations Governing Purchase and Sales Transactions provides for the award of contracts in those situations where the Transit Board determines that competitive bidding would be disadvantageous; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHICAGO TRANSIT BOARD
OF THE CHICAGO TRANSIT AUTHORITY:

SECTION 1. Based on the statements set forth in the preamble of this ordinance, the Chicago Transit Board hereby determines that competitive bidding for the additional licensing support is disadvantageous.

SECTION 2. The Chairman, or her designee, is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Unisys Corporation to provide additional licensing support to cover the final 4 months of Microsoft/Clearpath Unisys Enterprise Server, Model CS7402, in the not to exceed amount of fifty-eight thousand six hundred fifty-two dollars (\$58,652.00) under Requisition C06OP100363078.
