ORDINANCE NO. 010-110

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A CHANGE IN THE NAME OF LIBRARY-STATE/VAN BUREN RAIL STATION TO HAROLD WASHINGTON LIBRARY-STATE/VAN BUREN STATION

WHEREAS, The Honorable Harold Washington served as Mayor of the City of Chicago from 1983 to 1987; and

WHEREAS, The main branch of the Chicago Public Library, located at 400 South State Street, was named the Harold Washington Library Center in recognition of Harold Washington's commitment to reading and education, as well as the library's construction; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago Transit Authority's Library-State/Van Buren rail station is located adjacent to the Harold Washington Library Center; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago Transit Authority wishes to recognize Harold Washington's achievements and dedication to improving the quality of life of the citizens of Chicago; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHICAGO TRANSIT BOARD OF THE CHICAGO TRANSIT AUTHORITY:

SECTION 1. The Chicago Transit Board of the Chicago Transit Authority hereby authorizes a change in the name of the rail station now called "Library-State/Van Buren" to "Harold Washington Library-State/Van Buren."

SECTION 2. The external cost to change all signage, maps and recorded station announcements is estimated at Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000).

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
