ORDINANCE NO. 012-120

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A NON-COMPETITIVELY BID CONTRACT WITH CAREERBUILDER GOVERNMENT SOLUTIONS, LLC FOR ACCESS TO CAREERBUILDER.COM

WHEREAS, The Human Resources Department ensures CTA obtains the most qualified candidates to fill vacant positions; and

WHEREAS, CareerBuilder.com receives more than 24 million visitors per month; and

WHEREAS, CTA has successfully filled vacancies with candidates from CareerBuilder.com; and

WHEREAS, CareerBuilder Government Solutions, LLC ("CareerBuilder") has offered CTA a 48.69% discount for 50 job postings on CareerBuilder.com if CTA enters into a one year contract with it; and

WHEREAS, The Human Resources Department will pay a much higher rate per job posting without this contract; and

WHEREAS, CareerBuilder will also post CTA job postings on 50 additional job-posting sites, many of which reach a diverse community, and provide CTA with its own career page, all at no additional cost; and

WHEREAS, CareerBuilder is the only company with such extensive jobpostings that can provide all the services CTA needs at a reasonable cost; and

WHEREAS, Section 1.4 of the Procurement Policies and Procedures provides for the award of contracts of this type and amount for contracts that the Chicago Transit Board "determines that competitive Bidding is disadvantageous"; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHICAGO TRANSIT BOARD OF THE CHICAGO TRANSIT AUTHORITY:

SECTION 1. That based on the statements set forth in the preamble of this ordinance, the Chicago Transit Board hereby provides approval for the Authority to execute such a contract.

SECTION 2. That the Chairman of the Board, or his designee, is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with CareerBuilder Government Solutions, LLC in an amount not to exceed Ten-Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$10,750.00), under Requisition No. B12OP04201.
