

ORDINANCE NO. 98-82

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING PUBLIC  
BIDDING DISADVANTAGEOUS AND  
AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT FOR  
VIDEO EQUIPMENT

WHEREAS, The CTA's closed circuit television monitoring and security system at its revenue equipment and warehouse operations facilities at 901 Division Street needs expansion; and

WHEREAS, The original contractor, Video and Sound Service, Inc., has been provided access to sensitive building drawings and plans for installation and maintenance of the system; and

WHEREAS, Using the services of one firm for this requirement reduces risk and exposure to the Authority in the highly sensitive Revenue Equipment and Central Counting Area; and

WHEREAS, Section 54.3-5 of the Regulations Governing Purchase and Sales Transactions provides for the award of contracts in those situations where the Transit Board determines that competitive public bidding would be disadvantageous; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY CHICAGO TRANSIT BOARD  
OF CHICAGO TRANSIT AUTHORITY:

SECTION 1. That based on the statements set forth in the preamble of this ordinance, the Transit Board hereby determines that competitive public bidding for this equipment is disadvantageous.

SECTION 2. That the Chairman of the Board, or her designee, is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Video and Sound Service, Inc. to furnish and install video cameras and associated equipment required for expanding the monitoring system for revenue equipment and warehouse operations in the amount of twenty-two thousand three hundred thirty five dollars (\$22,335.00), under requisition C97RT 7231.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
