ORDINANCE NO. 002-22

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING PUBLIC BIDDING DISADVANTAGEOUS AND AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF RADIO ADVERTISING CONTRACTS TO PROMOTE OFF-PEAK RIDERSHIP AND OTHER CTA PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, It is the desire of The Chicago Transit Authority to promote its services and programs in an effort increase off peak ridership; and

WHEREAS, The Authority has chosen to promote awareness of its services and programs by advertising on select radio stations to maximize service information; and

WHEREAS, Radio stations have been identified as being of greatest benefit to CTA and the public to convey information due to their respective demographic bases; and

WHEREAS, To consider radio stations, other than those named herein, to provide this service, would be disadvantageous; and

WHEREAS, Section 54.3-5 of the Regulations Governing Purchase and Sales Transactions provides for the award of contracts in those situations where the Transit Board determines that competitive bidding would be disadvantageous; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHICAGO TRANSIT BOARD OF THE CHICAGO TRANSIT AUTHORITY:

SECTION 1. That based on the statements set forth in the preamble of this ordinance, the Transit Board hereby determines that competitive bidding for this service is disadvantageous.

SECTION 2. That the Chairman of the Board, or her designee, is hereby authorized to enter into contracts with the following publications for a period of eighteen (18) months at the specified dollar amounts and under the specified contract numbers:
