ORDINANCE NO. 001-176

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING PUBLIC BIDDING DISADVANTAGEOUS AND AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A CONTRACT TO ALSTOM SIGNALING, INC.

November 15, 2001

WHEREAS, The Authority requires replacement relay parts for signal relays manufactured by ALSTOM Signaling, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, These parts are manufactured by ALSTOM Signaling, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, Other signal manufacturing companies make similar parts however such parts would require changes in existing mounting bases, connections and circuit drawings in order for such products to function properly; and

WHEREAS, The cost of such modifications to make the alternative parts function properly in relay systems manufactured by ALSTOM Signaling, Inc. would exceed any possible price savings offered by competitors; and

WHEREAS, Section 54.3-5 of the Regulations Governing Purchase and Sales Transactions provides for the award of contracts in those situations where the Transit Board determines that competitive public bidding would be disadvantageous; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHICAGO TRANSIT BOARD OF THE CHICAGO TRANSIT AUTHORITY:

SECTION 1. That based on the statements set forth in the preamble of this ordinance, the Chicago Transit Board hereby determines that competitive public bidding for this service is disadvantageous.

SECTION 2. That the Chairman of the Board, or her designee, is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with ALSTOM Signaling, Inc. in an amount not to exceed twenty-four thousand one hundred four dollars and seventy cents (\$24,104.70) under Requisition No. C01FI7974.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
