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(Whereupon the meeting 1 2 convened at 9:35 a.m. as follows:) 3 4 SECRETARY RAY: Good morning. I'm Kent Ray, 5 CTA's General Counsel. The committee meeting 6 scheduled for this morning starting at 9:30, the Committee on Strategic Planning and Service 7 Delivery will be followed by the Committee on 8 9 Finance, Audit and Budget and the regular board meeting which is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. 10 11 December 8th, 2022, the Office of the Secretary issued a notice of changed format of meetings of 12 Committees of Strategic Planning and Service 13 14 Delivery and Finance, Audit and Budget and the transit board meeting scheduled for today, 15 16 December 14th. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, there 17 is currently in place a state-wise disaster 18 proclamation which has been renewed from month to 19 Pursuant to Section 7(e) of the Illinois 20 Open Meetings Act, virtual public meetings are 21 permitted while the disaster proclamation remains 22 in effect. Because the governor's office's



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disaster proclamation remains in effect in the

state of Illinois, the meetings of

December 14, 2022 are being held electronically or 1 2 virtually for members of the public. At this point we are ready to start the meeting of -- of the 3 strategic -- of the Committee on Strategic Planning 4 and Service Delivery. Chairman Miller? 5 6 CHAIRMAN MILLER: Good morning. I'd like to 7 call to order the December 14 meeting, Committee on 8 Strategic, Planning and Service Delivery. Kent, can vou call the roll? 9 SECRETARY RAY: Yes, sir. Director Ortiz? 10 11 DIRECTOR ORTIZ: Here. 12 SECRETARY RAY: Director Lee? 13 DIRECTOR LEE: Here. 14 Director Jha? SECRETARY RAY: 15 DIRECTOR JHA: Here. SECRETARY RAY: Director -- Chairman Miller? 16 17 CHAIRMAN MILLER: Here. 18 SECRETARY RAY: I note also present for the meeting are Director Jakes, Director Silva and 19 20 Chairman Barclay. Chairman Miller, you have a auorum with four members of the committee present. 21 22 CHAIRMAN MILLER: Thank you, Kent. Our first 23 order of business is the approval of the



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October 14th, 2022 committee minutes meeting.

I have a motion for approval? 1 2 Is there a second? SECRETARY RAY: 3 DIRECTOR ORTIZ: Second. 4 Thank you. Director Ortiz? SECRETARY RAY: 5 **DIRECTOR ORTIZ:** Yes. 6 SECRETARY RAY: Director Lee? 7 DIRECTOR LEE: Yes. 8 Director Jha? SECRETARY RAY: 9 DIRECTOR JHA: Yes. SECRETARY RAY: And Chairman Miller? Chairman 10 11 Miller, do you vote to approve the --12 CHAIRMAN MILLER: Yes. 13 SECRETARY RAY: -- meeting minutes? 14 CHAIRMAN MILLER: Yes. 15 SECRETARY RAY: Great. Thank you, sir. The 16 motion is approved with four yes votes. 17 CHAIRMAN MILLER: Okay. Thank you. Our next 18 order of business is a presentation update. CTA's 19 fare media program. Molly Poppe? 20 MS. POPPE: Thank you, Chairman Miller. Good 21 morning, Directors. I'm Molly Poppe. I am the 22 Chief Innovation Officer here at CTA. And I am 23 presenting an update on some recent fare changes 24 that we've made and -- and some further fare



changes that we anticipate in 2023. Next slide. In 2021 we launched a -- a successful pass promotion that reduced the passes -- reduced the cost of our one and three-day passes. We saw a growth in ridership from that -- that pass promotion reduction and so as part of the 2022 budget as you remember we did take steps to lower all of CTA pass products. We reduced the one. three, seven and thirty-day passes. And then, additionally, we launched free transfers between all CTA service. So now it is free to transfer between rail, to transfer between CTA buses or from a CTA rail line to a bus or vice versa. Later on in 2022 we launched the Regional Connect Pass which is an integrated pass product between CTA, Pace and It replaced the Metra Link-Up and what it did is it -- it allowed individuals who are a Metra monthly ticket holder to also have essentially a thirty-day CTA Pace pass to create that regional integration that we've been seeking. What we really seen from those pass products is improved satisfaction from our customers on those pass prices and the ease of use. We also have seen a growth in pass usage where we had anticipated



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as -- as a result of Covid individuals would be leaving pass products which tend to be more affordable long term, provide more riding access to a more pay-per-use base. So a pay-as-you-go. know individuals that are on pass products also tend to ride more and so encouraging people to be in passes is something we really wanted to continue to grow and improve. In 2023 we're going to continue with those successes and continue to add on to those pass products. Next slide. Just a little bit more on -- on the success that we've seen with the changes that we made. So with the thirty-day pass reduction from \$105 to \$75 we have seen a bit of a growth in the thirty-day pass It does -- it is still well below 2019 product. or -- or pre-Covid level but we did see an increase in the Pace share of the thirty-day pass pass product. On the seven-day side, the seven-day we continue to see an expanded use of the seven-day we're at actually 60 percent of pre-Covid pass. levels of that seven-day pass with usage continuing to grow there. Where we've really seen significant success is really with that one-day pass. The one-day pass product we reduced it from \$10 to \$5



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and one-day pass ridership has actually exceeded 2019 levels in -- in 20 -- 2022 which really shows us that the one-day is a really good option for customers and -- and they're finding it both an affordable option and they're using it to ride more. Specifically on the one-day pass we've seen a growth in ridership on -- on bus specifically.

Next slide. On the Regional Connect Pass, that was launched in 2020 -- in July of 2022. As I

mentioned, it replaced the Metra Link-Up. reduced the pass product from \$55 to \$30. And what we did is we really combined the Metra Link-Up and the Pace PlusBus into one low cost for Metra monthly ticket holders. What you can see on the slide here there's two different charts. right chart you will see a comparison of rides per month by Regional Connect Pass holders compared to what they were riding in 20- -- 2019 with the Metra Link-Up. As you can see, we're still below pre-Covid levels of ridership. But you see that number continuing to grow. So it really is -- even though we do have reduced ridership right now as we're coming out of Covid, we are seeing a growth in ridership and a growth in the use of the



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Regional Connect Pass. Now on the left side if you compare ridership of the Link-Up pass in 2021 to now, you can really see an exponential growth in -- in ridership by that Regional Connect Pass holder when you compare it to the Metra -- Metra Link-Up. So we're going to continue to -- to monitor these successful pass products and see how they're continuing to -- to expand ridership, if customers are really taking advantage of it.

One of the steps we're going to take today is further integrating with Pace. You can go to the next slide. We are going to add Pace to the CTA one and three-day. So previously we used to only have a CTA standalone one-day and CTA standalone three-day and then Pace was integrated on our seven and thirty-day. We're now taking a step to add Pace ridership to our one and three-day. So now customers who buy a CTA one-day or buy a one-day and a three-day, they'll be able to ride on Pace or CTA services for the -- the duration of that pass. Additionally, we're going to eliminate the standalone CTA seven-day pass and just launch with the CTA-Pace seven-day pass at now 25 -- or at \$20 which is a \$5 reduction in -- in



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that pass product. So at this point with -- with these integrations, the remaining standalone CTA fare -- fare product is going to only be that \$3 single ride ticket. Otherwise, CTA has really taken some crucial steps with our partners at Pace to have a fully integrated pass product that allow customers to very easily and seamlessly transition between Pace and CTA service through their pass products and continue to ride based on what works best for them. These particular pass products will become effective if the Board does approve in February of this year, February of 2020 -- 2023. Excuse me. With that, I will take questions, Chairman Miller.

CHAIRMAN MILLER: Thank you so much for the update. I don't have any questions. I think this is good for our customers. Just keep giving us update and we're looking forward. Thank you.

SECRETARY RAY: Director Ortiz, do you have any questions?

DIRECTOR ORTIZ: No questions. I just really appreciate the move in this direction. I think it's going to -- as you noted, there is some good progress and I anticipate they'll be even more with



1 the changes recommended. So thank you. 2 Director Lee, any questions? SECRETARY RAY: 3 DIRECTOR LEE: No questions. Just thanks for all the hard work. And I think it's really great 4 that we're working with the other agencies. 5 Especially, you know, it just shows that we really 6 7 are committed to mobilization across -- across the 8 Chicagoland area. So thank you. 9 Director Jha? SECRETARY RAY: 10 DIRECTOR JHA: No questions. Thank you. 11 SECRETARY RAY: Any questions from any other 12 directors present? 13 DIRECTOR BARCLAY: No questions. 14 SECRETARY RAY: Chairman Miller, there are no further questions. 15 16 Thank you.
