I'm Grea 5 Longhini, Secretary to the Board of the Chicago Transit Authority. 6 On December 8, 2021, this Office of the 7 8 Board issued a notice of changed format of meetings 9 of the committees and board meetings today. 10 There is currently in effect a state-wide 11 disaster declaration as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. So we are ready to begin the December 15th 14 meeting of Committee on Finance, Audit and Budget. 15 16 VICE CHAIRPERSON IRVINE: Good morning, 17 everyone. This is Kevin Irvine, vice chair of the 18 finance, audit and budget committee, chairing today 19 in the absence of Director Silva. 20 I would like to call to order the December 21 15, 2020 meeting of the Committee on Finance, Audit 22 and Budget. 23 will the secretary please call the roll? 24 SECRETARY LONGHINI: Yes. 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Jeremy Fine.

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JEREMY FINE: Good morning. I'm Jeremy Fine, your Chief Financial Officer. I'll give an overview of the October results as well as

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year-to-date numbers.

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for October revenues. They're following a similar

form of what we've seen over the past several

On the first page here, we see the results

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months. Fare and pass totals are down slightly to

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the amended and original budgets by about a million

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dollars to the amended budget and a little under

\$6 million to the original budget.

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Reduced-fare subsidy continues to come in as expected, however, that is half of what we have historically received and well below what we

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Nonfarebox totals continues to perform well. We see about \$1.2 million of positive variance on the amended budget and about \$600,000 on the original budget.

actually give out in free and reduced-fare rides.

So overall for the month of October, we

see revenues slightly positive on an amended budget



basis by about \$200,000 and down to the original budget by about \$5.2 million.

On the next page, you see the year-to-date numbers. Again, they follow a similar type form. Fare and pass totals are down about \$5 million to the amended budget, but positive by \$4.4 million to the original budget.

Reduced-fare subsidy is, again, coming in as expected. Nonfarebox totals are essentially flat, slightly positive on an amended budget basis and down about \$12 million to the original budget.

So overall, year-to-date, we see total revenues coming in essentially flat, slightly down on the amended budget basis about \$4.5 million and original budget about basis \$7.6 million.

With regard to our expenses, for October, we see labor coming in positive by about \$2 million. Material coming in negative by about \$500,000. Fuel and power continue to be strong performers for us providing, cumulative, almost \$1.5 million of variance, positive.

Injuries and damages is -- is coming in as expected and security services coming in slightly positive with other expenses rounding it out coming



in positive by almost \$1.2 million on the amended budget basis and a little over 500,000 on the original budget.

So overall for the month of October, we see positive variance to the amended budget by about \$4.7 million and just shy of \$4 million of positive variance on the original budget basis.

If you couple this with our revenues, we end up the month of October on an amended budget basis positive by about \$4.9 million and on an original budget basis we're slightly negative by about \$1.2 million.

with regard to year-to-date expense numbers, again, following a similar form of what we talked about on the monthly totals. Dropping down to the bottom line here, positive on an amended budget basis by about 43 and a half million dollars and to the original budget, we're positive by about \$42.3 million. Again, when you couple this with our revenues year-to-date, we're positive to the amended budget \$39 million and we're positive to the original budget by \$44.7 million.

On the next page, please. We see our public funding and it continues to perform very



well too. We see sales tax coming in about \$14 million to the positive on an amended budget basis and about \$15 million on an original budget.

PTF, the public transportation funds, are coming in positive by about \$7 million on an amended budget basis and about nine and a half on an original budget basis.

Real estate transfer tax is also performing well. We're positive by about \$2 million on the amended budget and a million and a half on the original budget, rounding it out with PTF and ICE where we're seeing about a million dollars of variance on an amended budget and original budget basis.

So that leaves us for the month about \$24 million to the positive on an amended budget basis and about 27 and a half million dollars positive on an original budget basis.

The cumulative effect is shown on the next slide. Again, dropping down to the bottom line here, we see about 167 and a half million dollars of positive variance on an amended budget and just shy of \$200 million of positive variance on an original budget basis. Next slide, please.



Here, we talked about the three sources of Federal funding that we've been allotted. The CARES funding is something what we've been using through the duration of the year here and we have about \$40 million remaining before that funding source is fully exhausted.

At that point, we'll switch to using CRRSAA and ARP funding for remaining gaps in 2021, 2022, '23, and into '24. So, again, we've been able to carry over the CARES funding here, but we will start needing to dip into the other sources of funding as we continue to move forward and as we continue to regain our ridership. Next slide, please.

with regard to the three commodities that we purchase, fuel, power, and natural gas, (indiscernible), not shown here, but we will talk about it in more detail next month. But quick highlight, we were able to buy additional fuel based on a temporary dip in pricing for 2023, about 28 percent there, and about 10 percent for '24 and 10 percent for '25. So we'll continue to look for opportunistic buys, not only on fuel but on power and natural gas, but as we've talked about in prior



months, we are locked in where we need to be, you know, for power and natural gas, but we will continue to look for those opportunistic buys, particularly in the fuel market, as prices avail themselves.

That concludes my report for the month of October. I'm glad to answer any questions.

SECRETARY LONGHINI: Thank you very much, Jeremy.

Director Irvine, any questions?

VICE CHAIRPERSON IRVINE: Thanks, Jeremy. The only question I have is just about nonfarebox revenues. I mean, they're going up. I'm seeing more ads on buses and trains out and about. I know we're doing better than this time this month last year. How are we doing compared to 2019 and previous years?

JEREMY FINE: Yeah, we're still seeing below, you know, 2019-type levels, but we are starting to see some -- some growth off of our budgeted expectations. As you indicated, you're seeing more ads returning to the system, you know, and that's a good thing.

So we'll continue to press intersection on



driving more advertising throughout the system and 1 2 looking for some, you know -- some expansion on that once things start to stabilize. But I think 3 that the larger economy coming back and stabilizing 4 has helped the advertising effort as well because 5 6 you had kind of a double whammy there for a while, 7 particularly at the front end of the pandemic. 8 where marketing budgets, advertising budgets had been cut because of just the general effect on the 9 10 economy, but you're starting to see that come back 11 as you're starting to see our ridership returning 12 So, you know, again, positive trends on as well. both sides and we'll continue to keep the Board 13 14 apprised as those continue. 15 VICE CHAIRPERSON IRVINE: Thanks, Jeremy.
