We are continuing construction on the Red and Purple Modernization (RPM) Phase One project to rebuild 100 year old rail infrastructure and improve transit service. Work will be performed that will affect your community and create inconveniences. We are committed to doing our best to minimize the impact of our work and will continue to keep you updated throughout the project.

EXTENDED STREET CLOSURE

Dates: Monday, October 24 to Thursday, October 27, 2022
Dates are subject to change due to weather and construction schedule adjustments.

Location:

- W. Argyle Street between the CTA tracks and N. Winthrop Avenue
- The alley behind 5000 - 5062 N. Winthrop Avenue
(W. Argyle Street to W. Winona Street)

Work Hours: 9pm-Monday to 5am-Thursday (continuous around the clock work)

Work Activity: Track Support Segment Installation

Local Impact:

- W. Argyle Street between the CTA tracks and N. Winthrop Avenue will be closed to vehicular traffic.
- W. Argyle Street between N. Broadway and the CTA tracks will be local traffic only.
- Sidewalk closures within the work zone will alternate between the north and south sides of W. Argyle Street.
- One sidewalk will remain open at all times.
- Access to the Argyle station entrance and businesses on W. Argyle Street will be maintained.
- Residents south of W. Argyle Street will need to access the alley via W. Ainslie Street.
- **Residents north of W. Argyle Street will not be able to access their garages/parking spaces in the alley behind 5000-5062 N. Winthrop Avenue.**
- The contractor will provide alternative parking for impacted residents.
- If you need further information about alternative parking, please contact the contractor, Walsh-Fluor, at 708-253-9772.
- The contractor will maintain garbage and recycling pickup.
- There will be noise while work is being performed, **including nighttime noise:**
 - General construction noise
 - Noise from lifting and placing track segments
 - Beeping from backup alarms on construction equipment and vehicle
 - There will be light in the work area
