

# Construction Activity Notice

We are continuing construction on the Red and Purple Modernization (RPM) Phase One project to rebuild 100 year old rail infrastructure and improve transit service. Work will be performed that will affect your community and create inconveniences. We are committed to doing our best to minimize the impact of our work and will continue to keep you updated throughout the project.

## UPDATED DATES SHORT-TERM DAILY STREET CLOSURES

**Dates:** **Tuesday, February 28 to Saturday, April 15, 2023**  
*Dates are subject to change due to weather and construction schedule adjustments*

**Location:** W. Ardmore Avenue between the CTA tracks and N. Winthrop Avenue

**Work Hours:** **7am to 5pm; weekdays & Saturdays**  
*(Prep work will begin at least ½ hour prior to start of shift)*

**Work Activity:** Material Deliveries

**Local Impact:**

- Crews will be hoisting materials with a crane up to track level, requiring short-term daily closures of W. Ardmore Avenue between the CTA tracks and N. Winthrop Avenue.
- **Closures may occur up to 4 days a week, we will notify the community at least 48 hours in advance of closures taking place.**
- The street will be open to local traffic on the west side of the tracks.
- There will be **No Parking** on the east side of the new viaduct within approximately 50' of the viaduct.
- Sidewalk closures will alternate between the north and south sides of the street.
- One sidewalk will remain open at all times.
- Residents north of W. Ardmore Avenue will need to access the alley via W. Thorndale Avenue.
- Residents south of W. Ardmore Avenue will need to access the alley via W. Hollywood Avenue.
- There will be noise while work is being performed. Noise will include:
  - General construction noise
  - Noise from crane lifting and setting equipment
  - Beeping from backup alarms on construction equipment and vehicles
