

Dear Vendor,

The Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) appreciates the opportunity to conduct business with a variety of vendors and suppliers. Vendors are encouraged to visit <u>Business Diversity Management System</u> to register with the CTA and/or apply for DBE certification. The Chicago Transit Authority Business Diversity Management System is designed to empower vendors to manage their own vendor record including DBE registration, maintain accurate contact information, and submit contract payment details online. The system is accessible to all firms doing business with the Chicago Transit Authority and includes the following key features:

- Fully automated online vendor registration
- Fully automated online DBE Certification Application process including New and No Change Affidavit Renewal Applications
- Tracking of vendor certification applications from submission to completion
- Automated communication with contractors via email regarding compliance issues
- Prime submission of subcontractor utilization reports with automated tracking of contract goals and participation
- Enhanced online certified directory with keyword search capabilities
- Immediate feedback on accuracy of certified payrolls
- Elimination of paper-based reporting and lengthy payroll validation delays

You may become an approved vendor by following these steps:

- Visit the CTA Business Diversity Management System
- In the CTA Vendor Registration (i-Supplier) section, select the CTA Vendor Registration button
- Select the New iSupplier Registration link; complete the Prospective Supplier Registration information and submit for approval
- Once approved, an email will be sent with a link to reset your password. The email address supplied becomes your username.
- To update your company information, return to the CTA Vendor Registration (i-Supplier) section, select the CTA Vendor Registration button
- Select the **Existing iSupplier Registration** link and logon with your email address.

CTA is notifying registered vendors of new publicly advertised contracting opportunities via e-mail. The e-mail notifications will be sent to CTA registered vendors by commodity.

CTA is pleased to announce it has engaged Bonfire to create a portal through which solicitations will be posted and where bids and proposals will be submitted. CTA is holding virtual bid openings for Invitations for Bids through our online contract platform.

CTA has transitioned to electronic submission through the Bonfire platform. **Hard copy proposals and bids are no longer being accepted.** Because CTA has moved to electronic submission, companies wishing to respond to procurements must register and upload their submissions through the Bonfire portal, available at: https://transitchicago.bonfirehub.com/portal/?tab=openOpportunities.

NOTE: You must register with Bonfire even if you are a current CTA registered vendor or currently do business with CTA. Registration is <u>easy and free</u>. Please be sure to select **NAICS** codes associated with your type of business or organization. Our solicitations will be set up using those codes and will be matched to vendors and contractors with the same codes.

CTA is excited about the changes we have made to streamline our electronic bid process and we look forward to continuing our good relationship with our vendors.

Q: What is a bid?

A: A bid is a vendor's response to a solicitation by the CTA requesting offers to provide a specific good or service.

Q: Does a vendor need to be pre-qualified to bid?

A: No, unless otherwise specified in the bid documents.

Q: How does a vendor become pre-qualified to bid, and how often does the vendor need to renew its pre-qualified status?

A: As stated above, a vendor does not necessarily need to be pre-qualified to bid. A specific solicitation may require pre-qualification. Regardless, vendors are encouraged to <u>register online</u>, which allows vendors to be added to CTA's database of vendors. Additionally, Vendors must register through CTA's Bonfire portal at https://transitchicago.bonfirehub.com/portal/?tab=openOpportunities in order to download solicitations and submit responses.

Q: Can I apply to become a CTA vendor online?

A: Yes, you can apply to become a CTA vendor online by accessing CTA's online vendor/DBE registration system at https://cta.dbesystem.com/. Additionally, Vendors must register through CTA's Bonfire portal at https://transitchicago.bonfirehub.com/portal/?tab=openOpportunities in order to download solicitations and submit responses.

Q: Does a vendor need to pay for bid specifications?

A: When required, you must provide CTA with cash, a cashier's check, certified check or money order, as specified in the solicitation document.

Q: Can bids be faxed?

A: Bids must be returned to the CTA in accordance with the instructions to bidders in the bid document.

Q: When are bids opened?

A: Bids are opened and read online through designated link provided in Bonfire for each procurement.

Q: What disqualifies a bid?

A: You should read the specification document very carefully and follow all instructions. This is the best way to keep from having your bid disqualified. In general, bids can also be disqualified for being late or missing information and/or signatures. Please note that this is not an exhaustive list of reasons for disqualification.

Q: When will the contract be awarded?

A: Contracts are awarded either following consideration and approval by the Board or in accordance with the established process for contract approval and execution for contracts that do not require Board ratification.

Q: Do I need to bid through a DBE?

A: No.

Q: What is a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE)?

A: A DBE firm is a firm which has been certified as being owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals pursuant to 49 CFR, Part 26. More information regarding CTA's DBE program can be obtained from the Diversity Programs Department.

Vendor FAQ Continued

Q: Where do I find a DBE firm?

A: The Illinois Unified Certification Program (IL UCP) publishes and maintains a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Directory which lists all certified DBEs in the State of Illinois. A copy of this directory can be at https://webapps.dot.illinois.gov/UCP/ExternalSearch, or you may contact the Diversity Programs Department.

Q: Who are approved DBEs?

A: Please visit the IL UCP DBE Directory (https://webapps.dot.illinois.gov/UCP/ExternalSearch) or contact the Diversity Programs Department.

Q: Can I apply and/or maintain my DBE certification online?

A: Yes, you can apply for DBE certification, and maintain your certification if you are already certified, online by accessing our online vendor/DBE registration system at https://cta.dbesystem.com/.

Q: I'm a certified DBE with the City of Chicago/the Illinois Department of Transportation/Metra/Pace, am I also certified with CTA?

A: CTA is a certifying participant in the Illinois Unified Certification Program (IL UCP). All firms that are certified with the IL UCP through one of the aforementioned agencies are considered DBEs with CTA.

Q: What is the Illinois Unified Certification Program (IL UCP)?

A: The IL UCP is based on the concept of reciprocity among the participants. The certifying participants of the IL UCP are CTA, the Illinois Department of Transportation, the City of Chicago, Metra and Pace. If a firm is approved as a DBE firm, this certification is honored by all IL UCP participants in the State of Illinois.

Q: How do I fill out Schedules C and D?

A: Please follow the directions in the bid document or contact the Diversity Programs Department if you need additional assistance.

Q. If my firm is currently certified as a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) or a Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE), do I need to be certified as a DBE?

A. Yes, CTA only recognizes certified DBEs for credit towards a DBE goal on its contracts.

Q. If my firm is currently certified as an MBE or WBE, will it qualify as a DBE?

A. Although some of the qualification criteria are similar, the DBE program is a federal program and the M/WBE programs are local programs. Therefore, you must submit a new application for DBE status.

Q: How do I get my product approved?

A: CTA's Technical Services department typically reviews and approves new products. To be considered, please contact the Bid Office via email at ctavendormgmt@transitchicago.com.

Q: Please explain the difference between purchases over and under \$40,000.00?

A: Purchases in excess of \$40,000.00 are required to be publicly advertised for bid. Purchases that are \$40,000.00 or less do not require public advertisement.

Q: Is everything that CTA purchases posted on the website?

A: No. All competitively bid procurements over \$40,000.00 are posted on the CTA's e-procurement portal at https://transitchicago.bonfirehub.com/portal/?tab=openOpportunities.

Q: Are the CTA Projected Contracting Opportunities an exhaustive list of all future contracts?

A: No. This document will be updated periodically and is subject to change without notice. Some contract opportunities may not be included in this plan.



Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program

The Chicago Transit Authority's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program demonstrates the Authority's continued commitment to the success of all disadvantaged businesses, including but not limited to minority and women-owned businesses, by promoting contracting opportunities to DBEs within transit.

The Chicago Transit Authority's DBE program is governed by the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) Regulations, 49 CFR Part 26.

DBE Certification Eligibility

Persons who are Black Americans, Hispanic Americans, Asian-Pacific Americans, Subcontinent Asian Americans, Native Americans or Women are presumed to be socially disadvantaged; other persons may be found to be socially disadvantaged on a case-by-case basis. In order to be economically disadvantaged, the majority owner(s) cannot have a personal net worth that exceeds \$1.32 million and the average annual gross receipts of the firm over a 3-year period cannot exceed \$30.40 million and the standard set by the Small Business Administration for the industry in which the firm operates over a 5-year period. In addition to meeting these requirements, you will need to provide documentation of your past experience and expertise in the area(s) of specialization for which your firm is seeking certification and demonstrate ownership and control of the firm.

Illinois Unified Certification Program (IL UCP)

Pursuant to the requirements of the federal regulations, 49 CFR, Part 26, all recipients of federal-aid must implement a "one-stop" certification process for Disadvantaged Business Enterprises. As a result of this requirement, the Chicago Transit Authority, Metra, Pace, Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), and City of Chicago have established the Illinois Unified Certification Program (IL UCP).

The IL UCP is based on the concept of certification reciprocity among the agencies. The IL UCP provides "one stop shopping" to applicants for Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) certification, such that an applicant needs only to apply once for DBE certification. This DBE certification will be honored by all participating IL UCP agencies in the State of Illinois.

DBE Certification Application

The DBE application has been developed to determine whether your firm is eligible for the DBE Program and to provide information regarding the certification of your firm in your designated area of expertise. In order to become certified as a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise, your firm must meet the eligibility standards established by the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) Regulation 49 C.F.R., Part 26. Once a firm is certified by CTA as a DBE, it will be honored by all IL UCP participating agencies. We suggest you contact each agency in order to receive additional information pertaining to their respective bidding opportunities.

The policy of the CTA is to facilitate competition by small businesses as prime contractors or subcontractors on CTA contracts. The CTA's Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program is part of its Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program as set forth in 49 C.F.R. Part 26.39. This program is designed to give certified small businesses an opportunity to bid as primes on CTA contracts. Under this program, selected contracts below \$5,000,000 in value will be set aside for small businesses to bid on as prime contractors.

Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program Eligibility

The following requirements must be met to be eligible to participate in the CTA Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program:

- 1. The company must meet the size standards for small businesses set forth by the Small Business Administration (SBA) for the industry in which it works over a 5-year average.
- 2. The company's annual gross receipts cannot exceed \$30.40 Million over a 3-year average
- 3. Each owner must not exceed personal net worth of \$1.32 Million.

Small Business Verification

The CTA only accepts Small Business Enterprise (SBE) certifications/verifications from CTA, Metra, Pace, and SEPTA. All DBE-certified firms are, by definition, small businesses and do not need to seek additional SBE certification.

The CTA will post on its website any additional entities that perform SBE certification or verification methods that will be accepted by CTA, as they become available.
