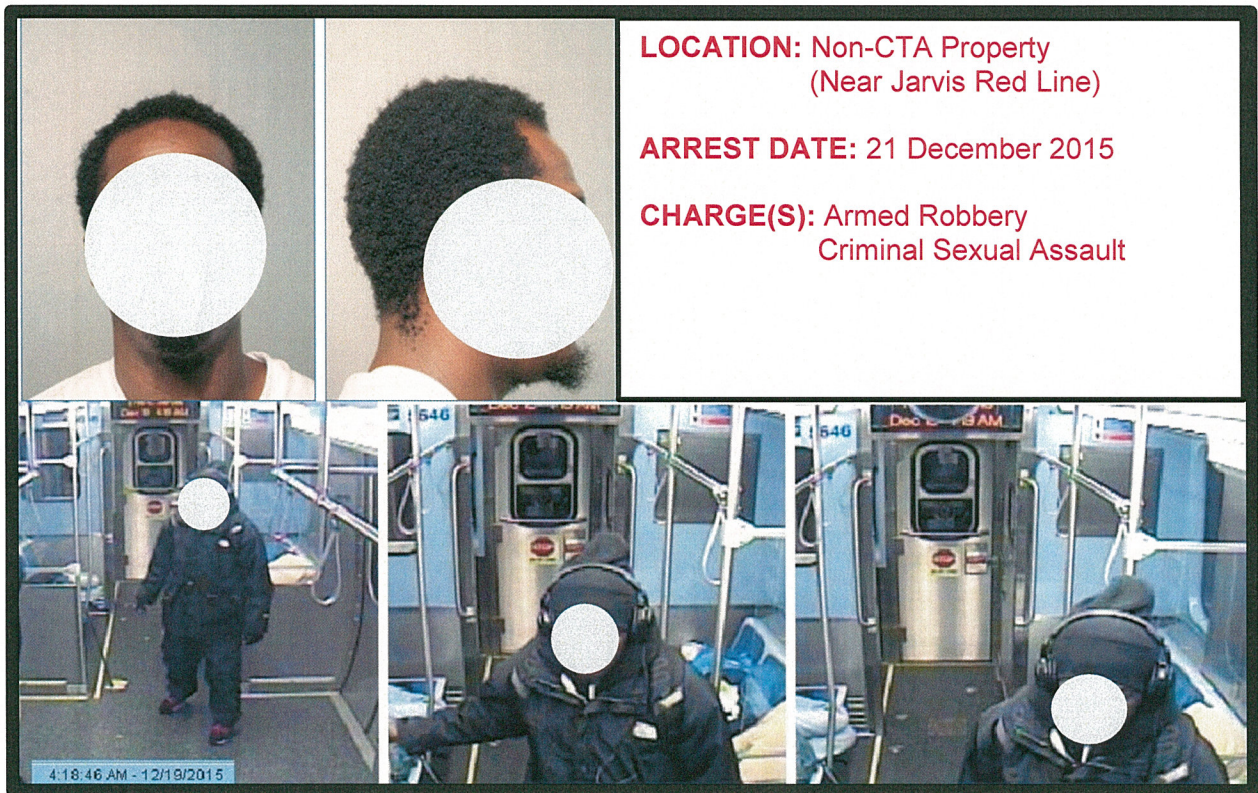




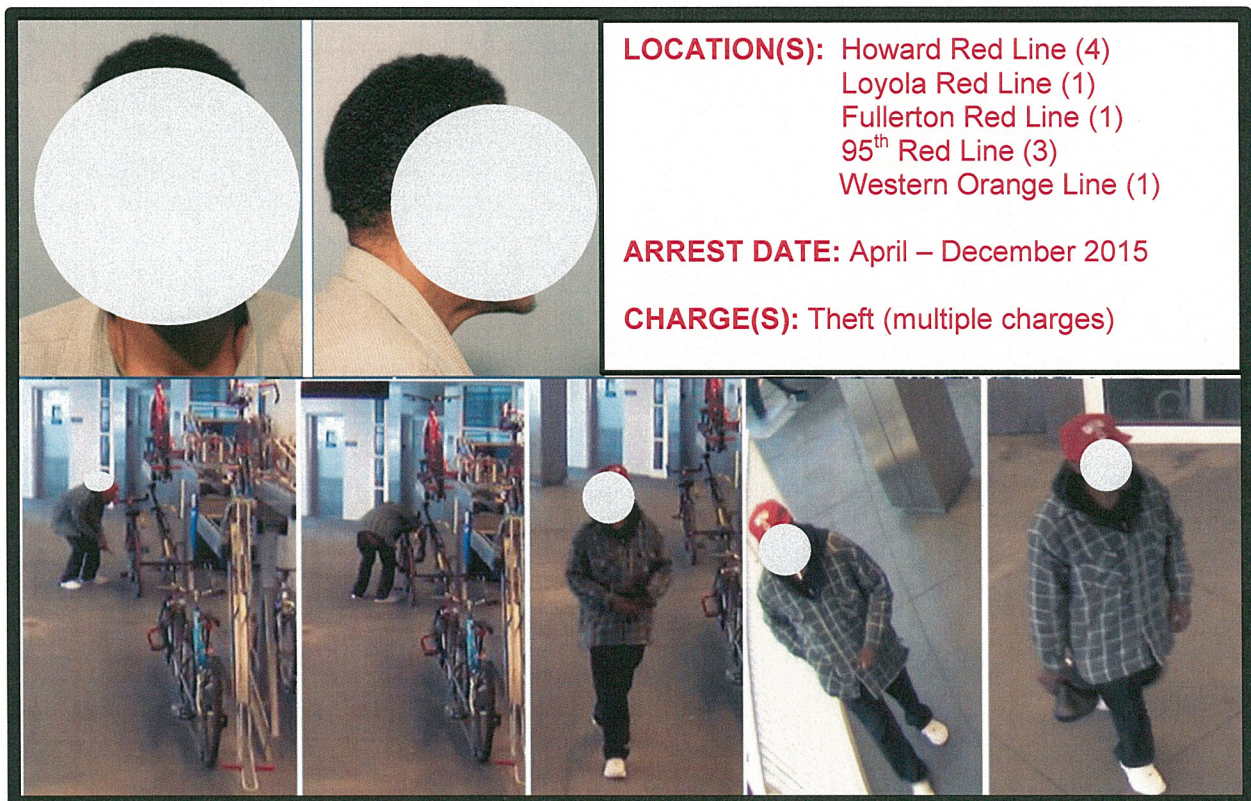
ARRESTED



In December 2015, a female was robbed at gun point and sexually assaulted in a secluded area approximately one block away from the Jarvis Red Line station. Using information provided by the victim, CTA Security personnel were able to pull images of the suspect from rail car surveillance footage. Shortly after investigators released images of the suspect to the public, he turned himself into local authorities. This person has been arrested and charged with two felonies – armed robbery and criminal sexual assault.

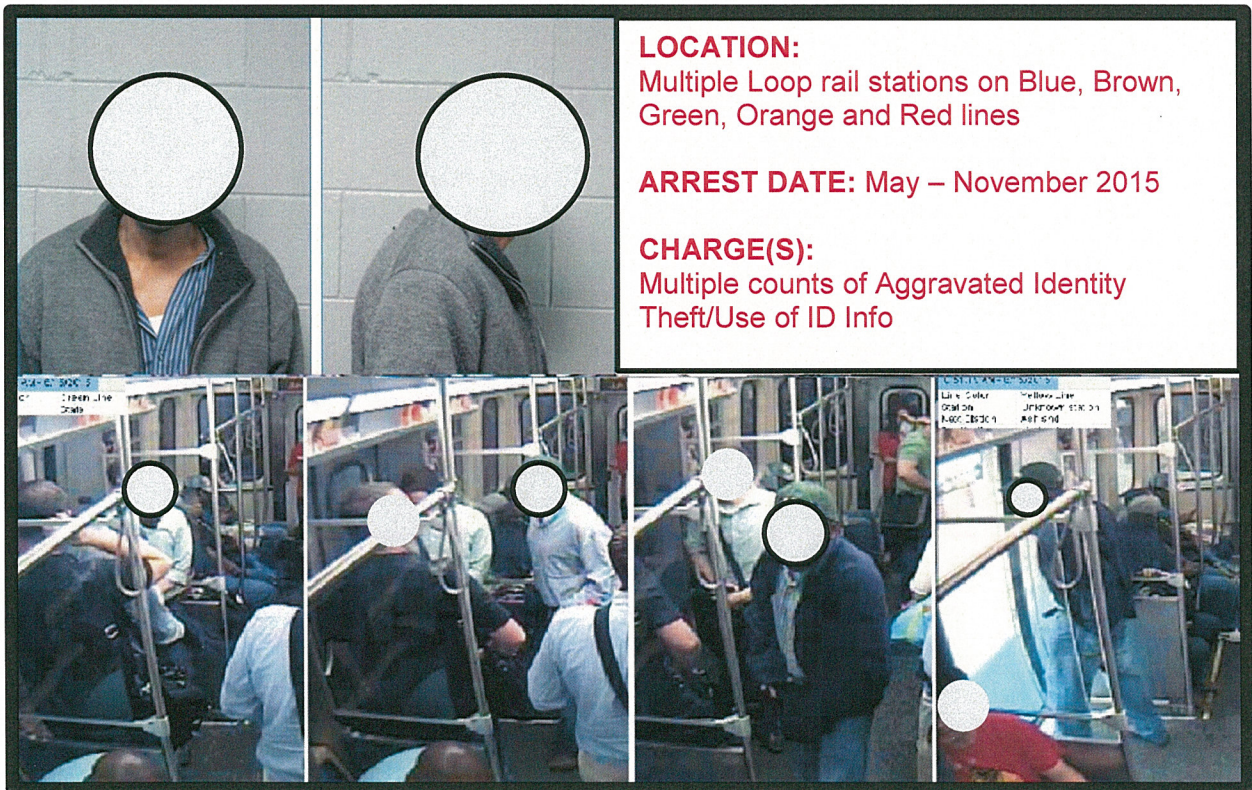
ARREST DATE: April – December 2015

CHARGE(S): Theft (multiple charges)

Images pulled from CTA surveillance cameras aided the Chicago Police Department in the identification, arrest and charging of an offender responsible for a string of bike thefts from CTA rail stations. Between April and December 2015, there were 10 reported incidents where locked-up bikes were stolen from multiple rail stations across the Red and Orange lines. In each of these incidents, the same person is seen on CTA surveillance footage carrying what appeared to be bolt-cutters, approaching the bike racks and walking away with a bicycle.



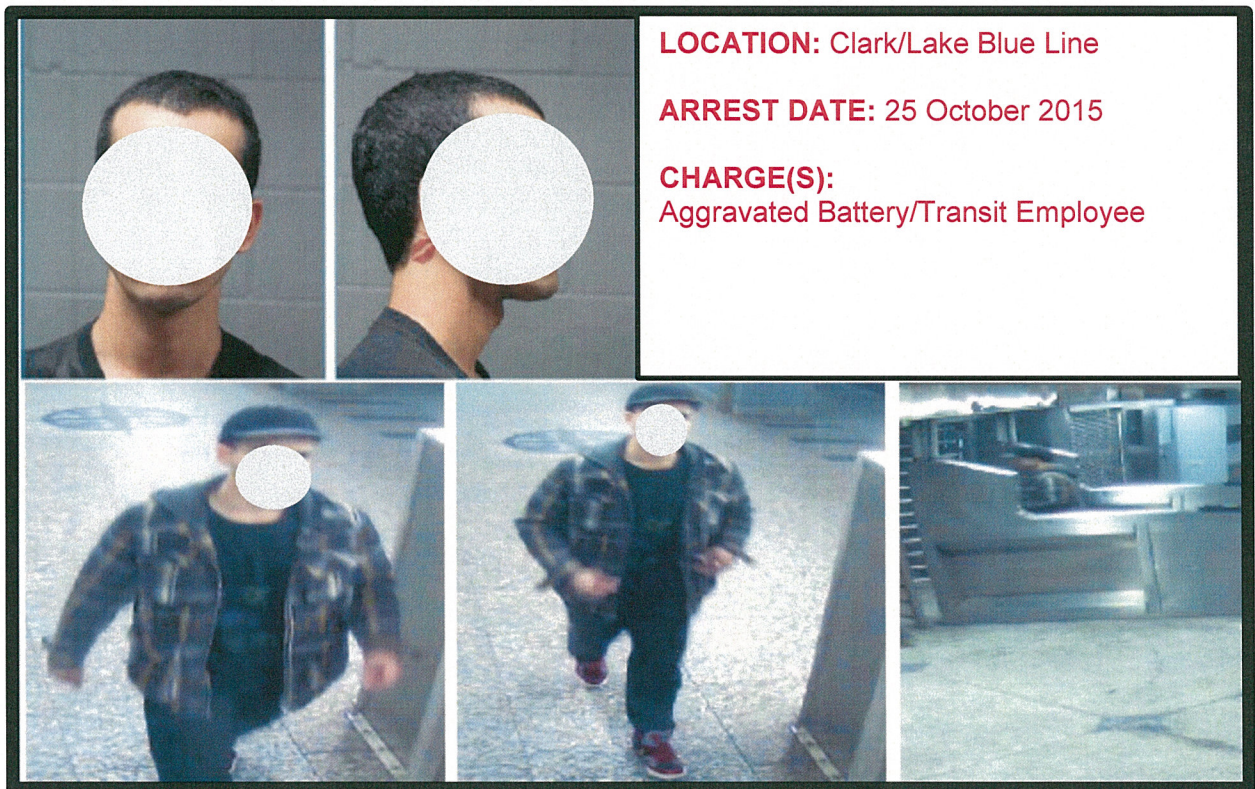
ARRESTED



Images pulled from CTA rail station and rail car surveillance cameras aided in an extensive investigation into a string of pickpockets occurring at downtown/Loop Elevated stations. With the use of these images, police were able to identify, arrest and charge this known pickpocket in connection with at least 21 incidents between May and November 2015.



ARRESTED



Police were called to the Clark/Lake Blue Line station after the above person allegedly approached the operator of a train stopped at the platform and punched him through the window before jumping into the operator's secured cab area. Riders engaged the offender, who was detained and arrested by police who charged him with aggravated battery of a transit employee.



ARRESTED



A woman reported being followed by the above person from the Roosevelt Orange Line station to a nearby building where he allegedly groped her in an elevator. Images pulled from CTA surveillance cameras were used as part of the investigation which led to the identification, arrest and felony charging of this person. A judge set his bond at \$5 million due to repeat criminal behavior, which includes a prior felony charge for videotaping up a female rider's skirt. This person is banned from CTA properties.



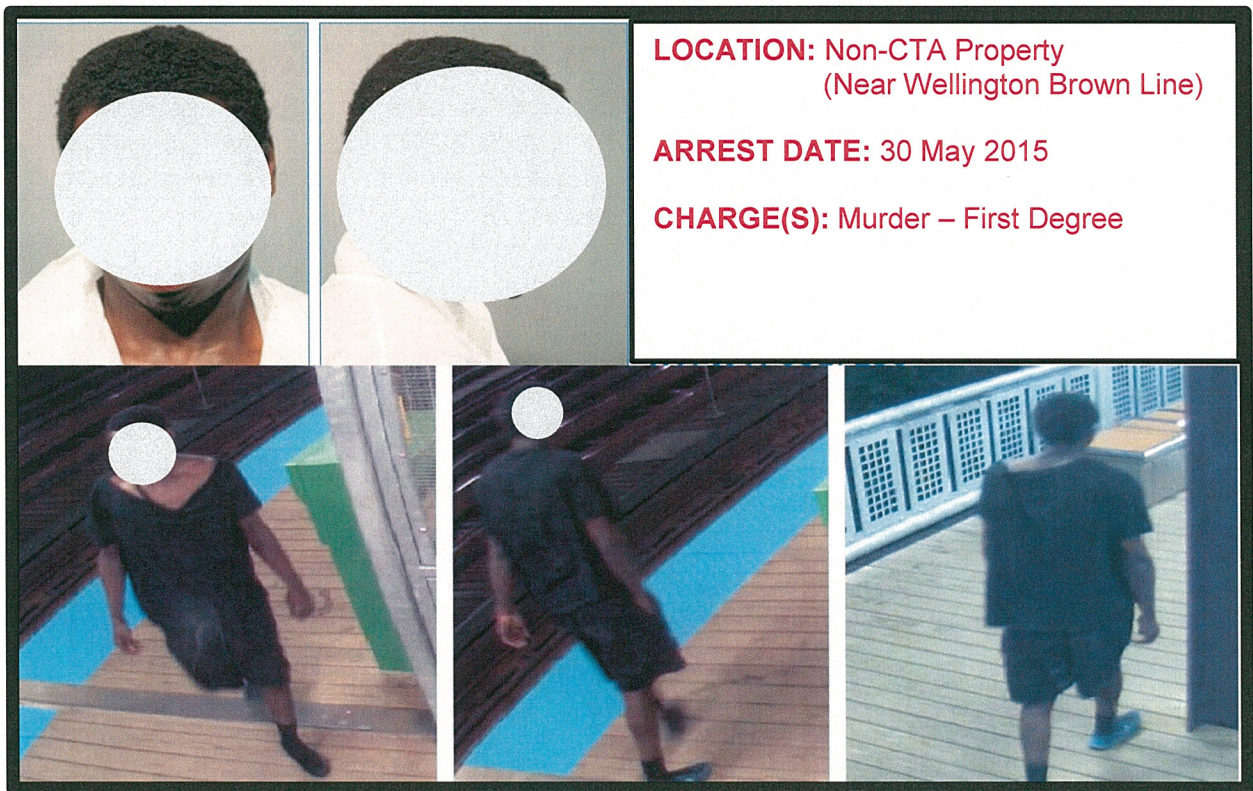
ARRESTED



CTA's Security Department received information that a bank near the LaSalle Blue Line station had been robbed and the offender allegedly ran into the station. Images pulled from CTA surveillance cameras were used as part of the investigation, which led to the identification, arrest and charging of the above offender, who was also charged with two counts of attempted aggravated robbery of two downtown stores the previous day.



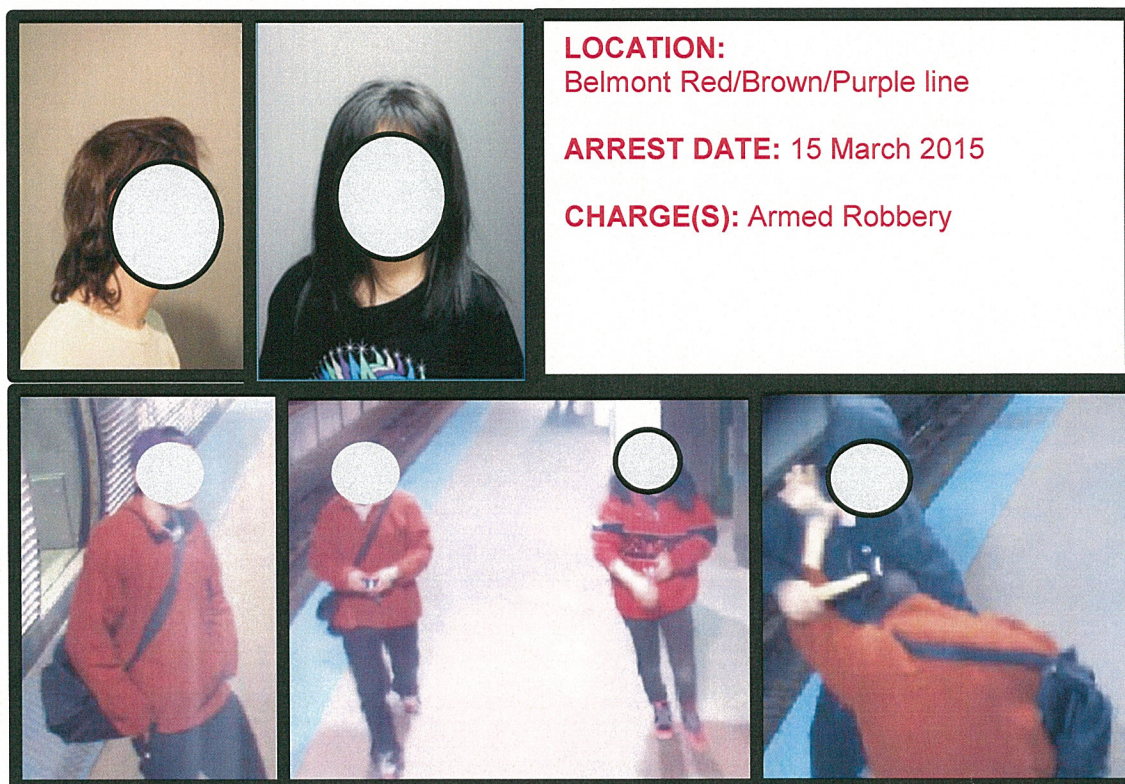
ARRESTED



In May 2015, in the 900 block of West Oakdale Avenue, two men were allegedly engaged in a physical altercation over a cell phone. During the dispute, the offender pulled out a gun and fatally shot the victim. The offender then fled the scene. Images pulled from CTA surveillance cameras were made part of this investigation, which resulted in the offender being arrested and charged with first degree murder.



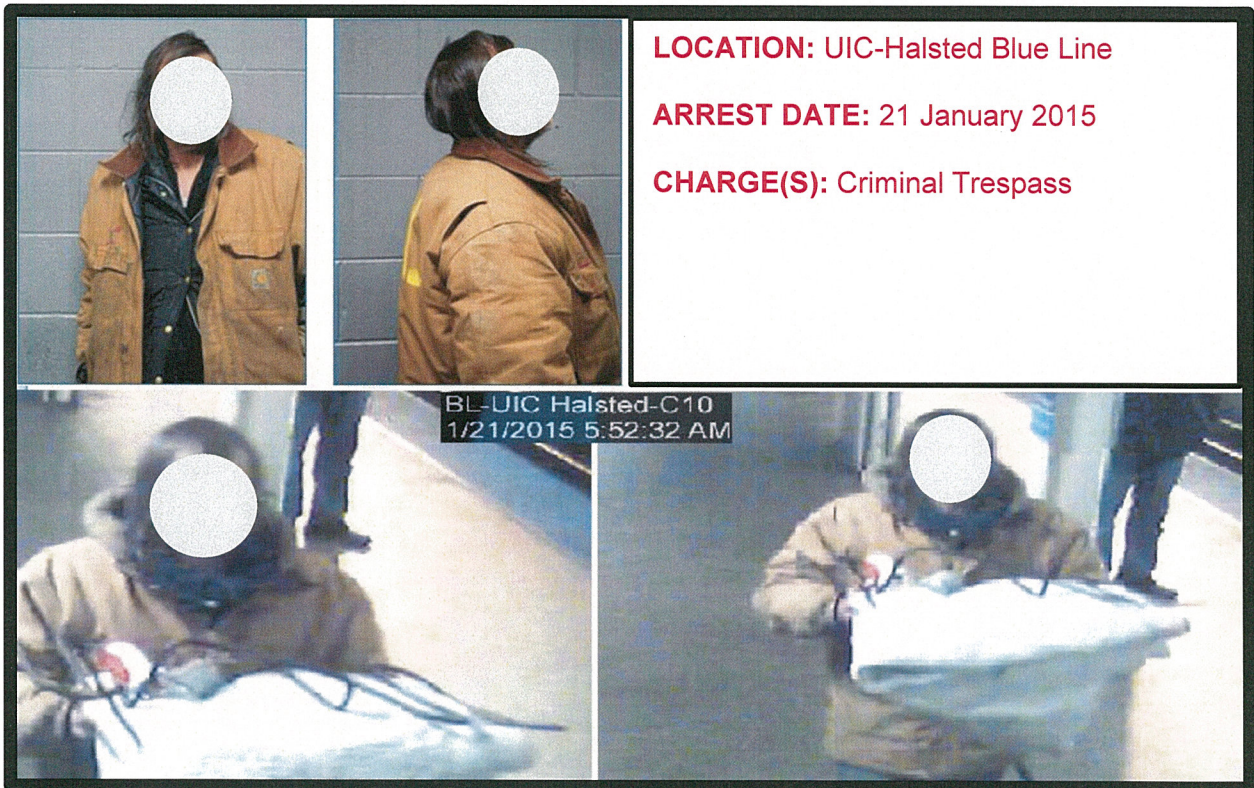
ARRESTED



Police were called to the Belmont Red/Brown/Purple line station in response to a report of two offenders—a man and a woman—robbing two passengers with a hammer. The offenders fled with victims' cell phones, wallets and a backpack. Police were able to quickly apprehend the offenders using a mobile device tracking app. Images from CTA's surveillance cameras aided in the arrest and charging of the two offenders.



ARRESTED



Person was observed being on the tracks at the UIC-Halsted Blue Line station. Police were called and as part of their investigation into the matter reviewed CTA surveillance footage, which depicted the offender underneath the station platform removing pieces of wire and other equipment and placing them on the platform for later retrieval.
