It is my honor and privilege to serve as the newly-appointed Executive Inspector General for the people of Illinois, including the many customers and employees of the four Chicago-area transit agencies (RTA, CTA, Metra, and Pace).

The Office of Executive Inspector General for the Agencies of the Illinois Governor (OEIG), established in 2003, is an independent, nonpartisan State agency that has jurisdiction over nearly 300 State agencies, boards, and commissions; the nine public universities; and the four regional transit boards. The primary mission of the OEIG is to promote accountability within these public entities. Our experienced and professional staff is fully committed to conducting objective and thorough investigations and will ensure that:

- our office is independent, objective, and fair;
- individuals who wish to report misconduct may easily do so with confidence;
- we conduct our investigations without bias and in a timely manner; and
- our work is transparent to the fullest extent allowed by law.

Since the OEIG assumed oversight of the transit boards on July 1, 2011, we have received nearly 1,500 transit-related complaints, which have led to investigations involving procurement and hiring improprieties; misuse of State and agency resources; and time and benefit abuse. We are your “watchdog” to ensure that transit employees, vendors, and Board members are meeting the highest standards of public service.
