AN ORDINANCE DECLARING
PUBLIC BIDDING
DISADVANTAGEOUS AND
AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT
WITH COMPUTER SCIENCE
CORPORATION FOR
MAINTENANCE AND SUPPORT
FOR THE AUTHORITY'S RISK
MANAGEMENT INFORMATION
SYSTEM (RMIS)

WHEREAS, The Chicago Transit Authority ("Authority") requires a risk management information system to manage its claims, including workers' compensation and general liability claims; and

WHEREAS, Computer Science Corporation ("CSC") currently provides the Authority with the required Risk Management Information System ("RMIS") and is the only firm that can provide performance guarantees and warranties for and that has the ability to resolve issues with CSC's proprietary system; and

WHEREAS, The Authority switched from its prior risk management system vendor to CSC in 2014 and incurred extensive implementation costs, so changing systems would require the Authority to incur such costs again; and

WHEREAS, Section 1.4D of the Authority's Procurement Policy and Procedures provides for the award of contracts without competitive bidding where federal funds are not utilized and the Chicago Transit Board determines that public bidding would be disadvantageous; and

WHEREAS, This procurement was reviewed and approved by the Authority's Sole Source/Disadvantageous Review Committee following no other vendor responses to its advertisement on the Authority's website for three weeks; and

WHEREAS, Staff recommends that the Authority award a contract under Requisition No. B19OP04192 to CSC for a Risk Management Information System for a term up to sixty (60) months with two (2) funded one-year options in an amount not to exceed One Million Two Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand Six Hundred Seventy-Four Dollars (\$1,234,674.00); now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHICAGO TRANSIT BOARD OF THE CHICAGO TRANSIT AUTHORITY:

SECTION 1. Based on the statements set forth in the recitals of this ordinance, the Chicago Transit Board hereby determines that it would be disadvantageous to seek competitive bidding for the goods or services being procured.

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SECTION 2. The Chairman of the Board, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute a contract with Computer Science Corporation for a Risk Management Information System for claims including workers' compensation and general liability claims for a term up to sixty (60) months with two (2) funded one-year options in an amount not to exceed One Million Two Hundred Thirty-Four Thousand Six Hundred Seventy-Four Dollars (\$1,234,674.00).

SECTION 3. The Chairman, or his designee, is further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to implement the objectives of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
