ORDINANCE NO. 020-92

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH GENUINE PARTS COMPANY D/B/A NAPA FOR A THIRD-PARTY VENDOR MANAGED INVENTORY (VMI) PROGRAM

WHEREAS, The Chicago Transit Authority ("Authority") requires a third-party Vendor Managed Inventory (VMI) program; and

WHEREAS, The VMI program includes supply chain inventory management services and procurement services for fleet vehicle parts, maintenance parts, and other parts and supplies, which may be utilized by various Authority departments including Bus, Rail, Facilities Maintenance, and Infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, The Authority issued a Request for Proposals under Requisition No. B19OP04611R for qualified firms to provide the required services, and Genuine Parts Company d/b/a NAPA's proposal was determined to be most advantageous to the Authority; and

WHEREAS, Staff recommends award of a contract to Genuine Parts Company d/b/a NAPA for a third-party Vendor Managed Inventory program for five years with one five-year unfunded option or five one-year unfunded options in an amount not to exceed \$400,000,000.00; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHICAGO TRANSIT BOARD OF THE CHICAGO TRANSIT AUTHORITY:

SECTION 1. The Vice Chair of the Chicago Transit Board, or her designee, is hereby authorized, pursuant to Section 7 of the Chicago Transit Authority Bylaws, Rules and Regulations and Rules of Order due to the absence of a Board Chair, to execute a contract with Genuine Parts Company d/b/a NAPA for a third-party Vendor Managed Inventory program for five (5) years with one five (5) year unfunded option or five (5) one-year unfunded options in an amount not to exceed Four Hundred Million Dollars (\$400,000,000.00).

SECTION 2. The Vice Chair, or her designee, is further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to implement the objectives of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
